# **Opinion**

- 2. The outbreak of Corona Virus (COVID-19) Pandemic has caused significant disturbance and slowdown of economic activity globally and in India. The following factors have affected the top line and bottom line of the company:
- i. Since January, 2020 there was unavailability of containers for export of containers to KOREA, Europe etc due to COVID-19 impact worldwide.
- ii. Around 30% of Soyabean crop has been damaged during the financial year 19-20, the same has significant impact on overall turnover and margin as the prices are volatile in conditions of shortage. iii. The Government has decreased Export incentive (MEIS) from 10% in the last financial year to 5% in 2019-20. This has directly affected the Gross Profit margins of the company because we have contracts booked in advance for coming six months.
